

Fitted with tactile sensors by senior engineering design students under the supervision of Dr. Grace Ni at California Baptist University (CBU), NAO responds to voice commands and can recognize objects and faces. Several NAO robots will surprise you with a group performance. E Taiko Drummers at the Riverside Convention Center, 4:30-5 pm

Be awed and amazed by the magic of traditional Japanese Taiko drumming. Taiko is believed to have been introduced to Japan through Korean and Chinese cultural influence between 300–900 CE. Some Taiko drums are similar to ones from India, Thailand, and Vietnam, and suggest a Southern Asia influence. Taiko ensembles will often use many types of drums, including the barrel-shaped nagadō-daiko as well as s maller shime-daiko. In addition to drums, Taiko ensembles may use vocals, string, and woodwind instruments for accompaniment.
