

Sons of the American Revolution 1-5 pm

The Sons of the American Revolution, Riverside Chapter, will present demonstrations and exhibits, including interpreters, documents, and artifacts, to bring alive the Revolutionary War period. The Sons of the American Revolution is a leading lineage society that perpetuates the ideals of the war for independence and seeks to maintain and expand the meaning of patriotism, respect for our national symbols, the value of American citizenship, and the unifying force of "e pluribus unum" that was created from the people of many nations -- one nation and one people.

Soldados y Californios de So Cal, 1-5 pm

"Soldados y Californios de SoCal," reenacts early California living history. Performers, demonstrations, exhibits, and activities bring 1769-1821 Spanish Colonial California to 1822-1847 Mexican California, military and civilian, to life.

Special Guest Speaker, Mark Rubin at the Culver Center for the Arts, 2 pm

Holocaust survivor Mark Rubin will present an oral testimony about his experiences in the Terezin (Teresienstadt) concentration camp. Rubin was born in Sabinov, Czechoslovakia, and was 7 years old in 1944 when his family was imprisoned in the concentration camp, located in what is now the Czech Republic. Of the 150,000 prisoners held there, an estimated 35,000 were children. When the Soviet Army liberated the camp

in 1945, there were 17,247 survivors, only 100 children among them.

Riverside's history, heritage, diversity and international spirit are tied to the monuments on the Main Street pedestrian mall in Downtown Riverside. You will see civil rights sage, The Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.; United Farm Workers founder and civil rights icon, Cesar Chavez; the hero of Korean independence and founder of the nation's first permanent Korean-American settlement in Riverside, Dosan Ahn Chang-Ho; India's Mahatma Gandhi who inspired them all; and, Eliza Tibbets, women's rights champion and mother of the second "gold rush" that propelled Riverside and the region to prosperity. Actors will emerge from the shadows of the statues of Mahatma Gandhi, Dosan Ahn Chang-Ho and Martin Luther King Jr and using the words of the statues themselves will provide dramatic insight into their world, their lives and their influence on our own existence."
